Report of the Senate Standing Committee on Legal and Constitutional Affairs

On 20 August 2009, the Senate Legal and Constitutional Affairs Legislation Committee handed down its [Report on the Personal Property Securities Bill 2009 \(Provisions\)](#). The Australian Government is considering its response to the report.

The committee has consolidated into a table many of the comments made to it about the Bill (Appendix 4 to its report).
